1. IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

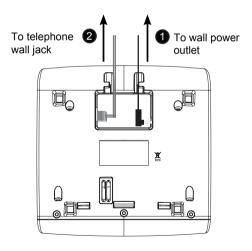

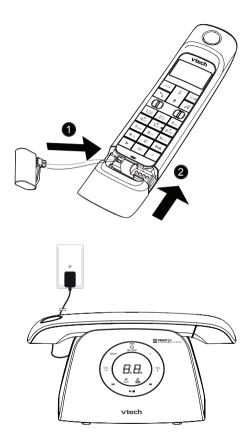
2.2 Connect the Base

2.3 Install and Charge the Handset Battery

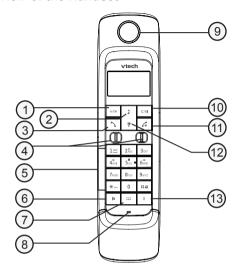

- If you do not use the handset for a long time, disconnect and remove the battery to prevent possible leakage.

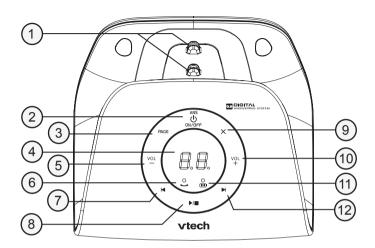

3.2 Overview of the Base Station



1. CHARGING CRADLE

Press to page all system handsets.

4. MESSAGE WINDOW

5. VOLUME -

Press to decrease the volume of an incoming call or message playback.

6. IN USE LIGHT

Flashes when there is an incoming call, the handset is in use, or the answering system is answering an incoming call.

7. ► REPEAT

Press to play the previous message.

8. ▶/■ PLAY/STOP

Press to play message or to stop playing message.

9. X DELETE

Press to delete the playing message. <u>Press and hold</u> to delete all old messages.

VOL

10. TOLUME +

Press to increase the volume of an incoming call or message playback.

11. III CHARGING INDICATOR

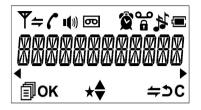
Turns on when the handset is placed on the charging cradle for charging.

12. ► SKIP

Press to play the next message.

3.3 Handset LCD display icons and symbols

The LCD display gives you information on the current status of the telephone.

4.3 Answer an Incoming Call

Lift the handset.

4.4 Adjust Listening Volume During a Call

To adjust listening volume during a call:

Press ▲/▼.

4.5 Mute / end mute a Call (Microphone Off/On)

To mute or end mute the microphone during a call:

5.3 Edit a Phonebook Entry

- 6. Press \oint /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow MELODY 1 MELODY 10.

5.4 Delete a Phonebook Entry

5.5 Delete All Phonebook Entries

5.6 Check Number of Phonebook Entry Used

You can check how many phonebook entries have been occupied in your phone and how many entries are available for you to store in the phonebook.

- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK twice $\rightarrow \triangle/\nabla \rightarrow PB$ STATUS.

6. PHONE SETTINGS

Your phone comes with a selection of settings that you can change to personalize your phone the way you like it to work.

6.1 Date and Time Settings

You will need to set the correct time and date so that you know when you received answering machine (applicable to model with answering machine) or call list entries.

6.1.1 Set the Date Format

- Press → OK → A/▼ → HS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \mathbb{A}/\mathbb{V} \rightarrow \mathsf{DATE} \& \mathsf{TIME}$.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow DATE FORMAT.
- 4. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow DD-MM-YY / MM-DD-YY.
- Press → /OK.

6.1.2 Set the Time

- Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → HS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow DATE & TIME.
- 3. Press \gg /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow SET TIME.
- Press ♦/OK → Enter time.
- 5. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow AM or PM .

6.1.3 Set the Date

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow HS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → DATE & TIME.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow SET DATE.
- Press ♦/OK → Enter Year.
- Press ⇒/OK → Enter Date.
- Press →/OK.

6.2 Handset Settings

6.2.1 Alarm

- 1. Press \oint /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow HS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ALARM.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ON / OFF.

If ON is selected:

- 1. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK \rightarrow Enter time.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow AM or PM.
- 3. Press ♦/OK. You will need to set the snooze function.
- Press ⇒/OK → ▲/▼ → ON / OFF.
- Press → /OK.

6.2.2 Set the Ringer Melody for External Calls

- 1. Press \oint /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow HS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow RING SETUP.
- 3. Press \Re /OK $\rightarrow \blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \rightarrow EXT$. RING.
- 4. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow MELODY 1 MELODY 10.
- Press →/OK.

6.2.3 Set the Ringer Melody for Internal Calls

- 1. Press \gg /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow HS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow RING SETUP.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow INT. RING.
- 4. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow MELODY 1 MELODY 10.
- Press →/OK.

6.2.4 Set the Ringer Volume

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow HS SETTINGS.
- Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → RING SETUP.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow RING VOLUME.
- 4. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow VOLUME 1 VOLUME 5, or VOLUME OFF.
- Press →/OK.

6.2.5 Set Alert Tones

A single beep is emitted when you press a key. You can turn on or off the key tone. You can also turn on the alert tones when low battery and out of range are detected. Low battery tone will be emitted while you are talking with the phone to alert you that you need to charge your battery. Out of range tone will be emitted while the handset is out of range from the base.

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow HS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow TONE SETUP.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow KEY TONE / BATTERY TONE / OUT OF RANGE.
- 4. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ON / OFF.
- Press →/OK.

6.2.6 Rename the Handset

- 1. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \mathbb{A}/\mathbb{V} \rightarrow \mathbb{H}S$ SETTINGS.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow RENAME HS.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/∇ \rightarrow Enter name.
- 4. Press -♦/OK.

6.2.7 Set the Auto Answer

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow HS SETTINGS.
- Press ⇒/OK → ▲/▼ → AUTO ANSWER.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ON / OFF.
- Press → /OK.

6.3 Base Settings (Using Handset)

6.3.1 Set the Base Ringer Melody

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow BS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow BS RINGER.
- 3. Press \Re /OK $\rightarrow \blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \rightarrow MELODY 1 MELODY 5.$
- Press → /OK.

6.3.2 Set the Base Ringer Volume

- 1. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \boxed{A}$ / \boxed{V} \rightarrow BS SETTINGS.
- Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → RINGER VOLUME.
- 3. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \triangle/\nabla \rightarrow VOLUME 1 VOLUME 5 / VOLUME OFF.$
- Press →/OK.

6.3.3 Set the Dial Mode

The default dial mode is best suitable for your country and network operator. It is unlikely that you should need to change this setting unless advised to do so.

- 1. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \mathbb{A}/\mathbb{V} \rightarrow \mathbb{BS}$ SETTINGS.
- Press ◆/OK → ▲/▼ → DIAL MODE.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow TONE or PULSE.
- Press → /OK.

6.3.4 Set the Flash Time

The default flash time is best suitable for your country and network operator. It is unlikely that you should need to change this setting unless advised to do so.

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow BS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow FLASH TIME.
- 3. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \triangle/\nabla \rightarrow \text{SHORT}$, MEDIUM or LONG.
- Press →/OK.

6.3.5 Change the System PIN Code

The default system PIN code is **0000**.

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow BS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press \Re /OK $\rightarrow \blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \rightarrow$ CHANGE PIN.
- Press → /OK.
- 4. Enter old PIN (Default: 0000).
- 5. Press \Re /OK \rightarrow Enter new PIN.
- 6. Press ♦/OK → Enter new PIN again.
- Press → /OK.

6.4 Reset Your Phone

You can reset your phone to the default settings. After reset, all settings and entries (except phonebook) will be deleted.

- 1. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \triangle/\nabla \rightarrow DEFAULT$.
- 2. Press ♦/OK → Enter old PIN (Default: 0000).
- Press ♦/OK twice.

7. CALLER DISPLAY

7.1 Call List

This feature is available if you have subscribed to the Caller ID service from your local service provider telephone company.

7.2 Store a Call List Number into the Phonebook

- 1. Press **₹**.
- 2. $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \rightarrow$ (a desired entry).
- 3. Press \oint /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ADD TO PB.
- 4. Press \Re /OK \rightarrow Enter name.
- 5. Press \Re /OK \rightarrow Edit number.
- 6. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow MELODY 1 MELODY 10.
- Press.

7.3 Delete an Entry in the Call List

- 1. Press <mark>♣</mark>.
- 2. $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \rightarrow$ (a desired entry).
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow DELETE.

7.4 Delete All Call List Entries

- 1. Press ♣?.
- Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → DELETE ALL.
- Press ⇒/OK twice.

7.5 View the Details of the Call List Entry.

- Press ♣?.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow **DETAILS**.
- Press →/OK.

8. ANSWERING MACHINE

Your phone includes a telephone answering machine that records unanswered calls when it is on. The LCD display (two digits seven segment display) on the base will show the number of the messages when the answering machine is on. The answering machine can store up to 59 messages within the maximum recording time of approximately 14 minutes. As well as recording incoming messages, you can record memos for other users of your phone. If the answering machine memory is full, the Handset will display **TAM FULL** and the handset name alternatively in standby, or display **TAM FULL** and the date/time information in standby which depends on which kind of information (Handset name or Date/Time) is selected to display in idle mode.

8.1 Turn On/Off the Answering Machine

You can turn on or off the answering machine through the handset. When the answering machine is set to **ON**, calls will be answered after the set answer delay and the caller can then leave you a message. When the answering machine is set to **OFF**, calls will be answered after 10 rings and the answer only message will be played to your callers. They will not be able to leave you a message.

To turn the answering system on or off:

Press $\bigcup_{ON/OFF}^{ANS}$ on the base.

-OR-

- 1. Press \Re /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow ANS. MACHINE.
- Press ⇒/OK → ▲/▼ → TAM ON/OFF.
- Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → ON / OFF.
- 4. Press -♦/OK.

NOTES

- If answering machine is set to ON, on displays on the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display the number of incoming messages.
- If answering machine is set to OFF, will disappear from the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display -.

8.2 Play messages on TAM

If you have new messages, they are played first, and then saved as old messages until they are deleted. Old messages are played again after all new messages are played completely.

Using the base:

- Press ►/■ listen to messages and memos.
- Press ►/■ again stop the playback.
- Press

 once repeat the current message from the beginning.
 Press

 twice skip back to the previous message during message playback.
- Press ► skip the current message and listen to the next message.
 Press X delete the current message being played.

Using the handset:

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow ANS. MACHINE.
- Press ⇒/OK → ▲/▼ → MSG PLAYBACK.
- 3. Press ♦/OK to start playing back the messages from speakerphone.

Options on handset during message playback

- Press 5 stop message playback.
- Press 4 skip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning.
 Press 4 twice skip backward to the previous message.
- Press 6 skip to play next message.
- Press 2 delete the current message playback

8.3 Delete all Messages in the Answering Machine

Using the base:

Press and hold **X** – delete all previously reviewed messages.

Using the handset:

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ANS. MACHINE.
- Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → DELETE ALL.
- Press ♦/OK twice.

NOTES

- You cannot delete new messages, so you will have to play them before trying to delete.
- If there is no more message in the answering machine, "EMPTY" will display
 and the handset will return to ANS. MACHINE menu.

8.4 Record Memo on the Answering Machine

You can record your memo message for another user. When you record a memo, the message counter will increase by one and the message can be played in the same way as answering machine messages. Memo recording can still function even when the answering machine is turned off.

Using the handset:

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow ANS. MACHINE.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\Psi \rightarrow$ MEMO.
- Press ⇒/OK → start recording.
- Press ⇒/OK save the memo.

-OR-

Press $\mathbb{C}/\otimes \mathbb{I}$ – not to save the memo.

8.5 Answering Machine Settings

You can use the **TAM SETTINGS** menu through the handset to change the settings of your answering machine.

8.5.1 Set the Answer Mode

By default, the answer machine is set in **ANS & REC** mode, which allows callers to leave a message. This mode can be changed to **ANSWER ONLY**, which does not allow callers to leave a message. In that case, your callers will be prompted to call back later.

Using the handset:

- 1. Press \Re /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow ANS. MACHINE.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow TAM SETTINGS.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ANSWER MODE.
- 4. Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → ANS & REC / ANSWER ONLY.
- Press → /OK.

8.5.2 Record your Outgoing Message (OGM)

You can record your own OGM for **ANS & REC** mode or **Answer Only** mode. When you record your own OGM, it will be used when the answering machine answers the call. If your personalized OGM is deleted, the pre-set OGM will be restored automatically.

Using the handset:

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow ANS. MACHINE.
- Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → TAM SETTINGS.
- 3. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \mathbb{A}/\mathbb{V} \rightarrow \mathbf{OGM}$ SETTINGS.
- 4. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown \rightarrow ANS & REC / ANSWER ONLY.
- 5. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow RECORD MESS.
- Press ♦/OK → start recording.
- Press ⇒/OK save the OGM.

-OR-

Press 6 - not to save the OGM.

8.5.3 Playback the Outgoing Message (OGM)

You can playback your own personalized OGM or the pre-set OGM for **ANS & REC** mode or **ANSWER ONLY** mode and choose to delete your personalized OGM during playback and record a new one whenever you want. Please note that pre-set OGM cannot be deleted.

Using the handset:

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow ANS. MACHINE.
- Press ⇒/OK → ▲/▼ → TAM SETTINGS.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow OGM SETTINGS.
- Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → ANS & REC / ANSWER ONLY.
- 5. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow PLAYBACK.
- Press ⇒/OK start playing.
- Press ⇒/OK stop playing.

NOTE

If a personalized OGM is not recorded before, the pre-set OGM will be played.

8.5.4 Delete a personalized OGM (Set OGM to default)

Using the handset:

- 1. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \triangle/\nabla \rightarrow ANS$. MACHINE.
- Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → TAM SETTINGS.
- 3. Press \Re /OK $\to \blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \to OGM$ SETTINGS.
- 4. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown \rightarrow ANS & REC / ANSWER ONLY.
- 5. Press \Re /OK $\rightarrow \blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \rightarrow PLAYBACK$.
- Press ⇒/OK start playing.
- 7. Press $\mathbb{C}/\otimes |$ delele the OGM.

8.5.5 Set the Answer Delay

You can set the number of rings before the answering system answers and starts playing your OGM. You can set the answering system to answer after two to nine rings or **TIME SAVER**.

Using the handset:

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ANS. MACHINE.
- 2. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \mathbb{A}/\mathbb{V} \rightarrow \mathsf{TAM}$ SETTINGS.
- 3. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \triangle/\nabla \rightarrow ANSWER DELAY$.
- Press ⇒/OK → ▲/▼ → No. of Rings.
- Press → /OK.

8.5.6 Set the Recording Time of Incoming Message

You can set the maximum length of the recording time of the incoming messages.

Using the handset:

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ANS. MACHINE.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow TAM SETTINGS.
- 3. Press \Re /OK $\rightarrow \blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \rightarrow RECORD TIME.$
- Press ⇒/OK → ▲/▼ → Recording time.
- Press → /OK.

8.5.7 Turn On or Off the Base Screening

Using the handset:

You can select to turn on or off the call screening on base.

- 1. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \triangle/\nabla \rightarrow ANS$. MACHINE.
- 2. Press \gg /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow TAM SETTINGS.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow BS SCREENING.
- 4. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ON / OFF.
- Press → /OK.

8.5.8 Change the Compression Rate

Using the handset:

Three different compression rates (**HIGH**, **MID**, and **LOW**) are provided for you to select different quality levels of recording incoming message. The lower the compression rate, the higher the recording quality level attained.

- 1. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \frac{1}{2}$ / $\frac{1}{2}$ \rightarrow ANS. MACHINE.
- Press ⇒/OK → ▲/▼ → TAM SETTINGS.
- 3. Press \Re /OK $\to \blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \to \mathsf{COMPRESSION}$.
- 4. Press \gg /OK $\rightarrow \blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \rightarrow$ Compression rate.
- Press → /OK.

8.5.9 Activate remote access

Your phone lets you check your messages, or otherwise operate your answering system, remotely. You can do this by calling the answering system when you are away from home and entering a 4-digit remote access PIN on a tone-dialing phone. Use the 4-digit remote access PIN code to prevent unauthorized access to your answering system.

8.5.9.1 Change the 4-Digit Remote Access PIN

Using the handset:

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ANS. MACHINE.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow TAM SETTINGS.
- 3. Press \gg /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow CHANGE PIN.
- Press ⇒/OK → enter old PIN (default: 0000).
- 5. Press \Re /OK \rightarrow enter new PIN.
- 6. Press $\frac{4}{3}$ /OK \rightarrow enter new PIN again.
- 7. Press -♦/OK

NOTE

If the new PIN entered in Step 6 is not matched with the new system PIN entered in Step 5, user is requested to enter the valid system PIN again in Step 5.

Press ⇒/OK.

8.5.9.2 Activate or Deactivate Remote Access

Using the handset:

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ANS. MACHINE.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow TAM SETTINGS.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow REMOTE ACCESS.
- 4. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ON / OFF.
- Press ⇒/OK.

8.5.9.3 Access Your Answering Machine Remotely

You can ring your phone from another tone-dialing phone to switch on or off the answering machine and listen to your messages remotely.

- 1. Call from a tone-dialing phone to your phone.
- When the answering machine answers the calls and starts playing the OGM, press *.
- 3. Enter the 4-digit Remote Access PIN (default: 0000).
- 4. Press the following keys to carry out your desired function.

Keys	Functions		
	While message is not playing	While message is playing	
2		Delete the current message playback.	
4		Skip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning. Press twice to skip backward to the previous message.	
5	Play the message.	Stop the current message playback.	
6		Skip to play the next message.	
7	Turn on the answering machine.		
8		Stop the current message playback.	
9	Turn off the answering machine.		
*	Enter the 4-digit remote access PIN.		

NOTES:

- If your answering machine is switched off, the phone will enter into the remote access mode after 10 rings. You can press and then enter the 4-digit remote access PIN (Default Remote Access PIN is 0000) to activate the remote access feature.
- When your answering machine memory is full and the answer mode is in ANS & RECORD, the answer mode will change to ANSWER ONLY automatically.
 - It will change to ANS & RECORD mode automatically after some messages have been deleted

8.5.10 Call Screening

When the answering machine is set to **ON** and when there is an incoming message, the base will start call screening automatically after the preset numbers of rings of answer delay.

At any time if you want to pick up the call, you can press \ on the handset and the message recording will be stopped automatically. If the answering machine is in the process of recording, the message already stored will be saved.

9. TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Solutions
My telephone does not work at all.	Make sure the batteries are installed and charged correctly. For optimum daily performance, return the handset to the telephone base after use.
	 Remove and reinstall the batteries, then charge for up to 16 hours. If the problem isn't solved, purchase new batteries.
	Make sure the power adapter is securely plugged into an outlet not controlled by a wall switch.
	Make sure the telephone line cord is plugged firmly into the telephone base and the telephone wall jack.
Common cure for electronic equipment.	If the telephone is not responding normally, put the handset in the telephone base. If it does not respond, try the following (in the order listed):
	Disconnect the power to the telephone base.
	Disconnect the batteries on the handset.
	Wait a few minutes before connecting power to the telephone base.
	Re-install the batteries and place the handset in the telephone base.
	Wait for the handset to synchronize with the telephone base. Allow up to one minute for this to take place.
