1. IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS







This feature is available if you have subscribed to the Caller ID service from your local service provider telephone company.

- 3. Press Option $\rightarrow \triangle/\nabla \rightarrow$ Store Number.
- 4. Press **OK** → Enter name.
- 5. Press **⊙K** → Edit number.
- 6. Press $\mathbf{OK} \rightarrow \mathbf{A/V}$ (a desired melody).
- 7. Press OK.

7.3 Delete an Entry in the Call List

- 1. Press **₹**.
- 2. $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \rightarrow$ (a desired entry).
- 3. Press Option $\rightarrow \triangle/\nabla \rightarrow$ Delete Entry.
- 4. Press OK.
- 5. Press Yes.

7.4 Delete All Call List Entries

- Press [♣]?.
- 2. Press Option $\rightarrow \triangle/\nabla \rightarrow$ Delete All.
- 3. Press OK.
- 4. Press Yes.

7.5 Dial a Phonebook Entry

- Press ♣?.
- 2. $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \rightarrow$ (a desired entry).
- 3. Press \(\rightarrow\) to dial out.

7.6 Store a Call List Number into the Blacklist

- 1. Press **♣**?.
- 2. $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \rightarrow$ (a desired entry).
- 3. Press Option $\rightarrow \triangle/\nabla \rightarrow Add$ to Blacklist.
- 4. Press $\mathbf{OK} \rightarrow \text{Enter name}$.
- 5. Press $\mathbf{OK} \rightarrow \mathsf{Edit}$ number.
- 6. Press OK.

8. CALL BLOCKER

If you have subscribed to Caller ID service, you can use the call blocker feature to block certain calls automatically by adding numbers into the Black List.

You can also choose to block all calls or allow certain calls in the VIP list.

When a call is blocked, the telephone will not ring.

8.1 Choose the Block Mode

- 1. Press Menu $\rightarrow A/V \rightarrow Call Blocker$.
- 2. Press $\mathbf{OK} \to \mathbf{A/V} \to \mathbf{Settings}$.
- 3. Press **OK** → **Block Mode**.
- 4. Press OK → ▲/▼ → Block All / Allow VIP / Block Blacklist / Off.
- 5. Press **OK** → Always On / Timed.
- 6. Press $\mathbf{OK} \rightarrow$

NOTES

- · If Off is chosen is step 4, the setting is ended there.
- · If Timed is chosen in step 5, you will need to set the time period.

8.2 Add a Number into the Black List

- 1. Press Menu $\rightarrow \land / \checkmark \rightarrow Call Blocker$.
- Press OK → Black List.
- 3. Press $\mathbf{OK} \rightarrow \mathbf{New} \; \mathbf{Entry}$.
- Press OK → Enter name.
- 5. Press $OK \rightarrow$ Enter number.
- 6. Press OK.

8.3 Edit a Black List Entry

- Press Menu → ▲/▼ → Call Blocker.

9. TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Solutions	
My telephone does not work at all.	Make sure the batteries are installed and charged correctly. For optimum daily performance, return the handset to the telephone base after use.	
	 Remove and reinstall the batteries, then charge for up to 16 hours. If the problem isn't solved, purchase new batteries. 	
	Make sure the power adapter is securely plugged into an outlet not controlled by a wall switch.

Common cure for electronic equipment.	If the telephone is not responding normally, put the handset in the telephone base. If it does not respond, try the following (in the order listed):	
	Disconnect the power to the telephone base.

	Wait a few minutes before connecting power to the telephone base.	
	Re-install the batteries and place the handset in the telephone base.	
	Wait for the handset to synchronize with the telephone base. Allow up to one minute for this to take place.
